## Letter from the Music Director:

Greetings, Choir School Community!

I am so thrilled to be starting another program year with our fabulous choristers. Every year it is a joy to welcome in new choristers and bittersweet to miss our choristers who have recently graduated and are now attending college. Celine and Chi-Chi, your presence is still very much still with us!

I am proud to announce 4 new choristers in our program this year. At the time I am writing this, we have only been rehearsing for about a month, but they are already building great friendships and strong musical foundations.


Choir Course Week (August 22-26) was packed with all sorts of activities every day from 9:00am-5:00pm. There were sessions on conducting, handbells, percussion, as well a workshops on spatial awareness, miniature organ building, conversations about consonance and dissonance, studies in harmonic progressions and melody shape, and a project to compose an original piece of music by the end of the week. Our guests this year were Sarah Kaufold (Music Director of Consonare Choral Community and Voices of Concinnity), who led a session on vocal color, overtones, and the harmonic series; Gabriel Löfvall (Music Director of Chorus Angelicus and St. Patrick-St. Anthony), who led a session of Hispanic choral repertoire; John Michael Walker (Tenor Section Leader at Trinity Episcopal Church) who taught us about International Phonetic Alphabet; and Benjamin Rauch (lecturer and conductor at The Hartt School) who offered a vocal masterclass. We are so grateful for their coaching!

On September 11th, our choristers sang their first Sunday service of the season and celebrated at a reception afterward. In the weeks since, we've sung works by Pitoni, Hairston, Hurford, Tye, and Maultsby as well as folk songs from East Africa, Argentina, and Latvia. We're looking forward to some fun events on the horizon, including **Open Bell Day** on <u>Sunday, October 9th at 9am</u>, when we invite our friends and families to ring bells with us. We've also begun preparation for **Haydn's** *Missa Brevis:* a **Choir School Fundraiser Concert** on <u>Sunday, November 20th at 4pm</u>. In this concert, we will be joined by the Trinity Adult Choir, guest singers from other communities, a professional string ensemble, and 2 professional soloists. A reception will follow the concert with all kinds of delicious goodies to eat and drink. And then, for the Christmas season, we are doing an **Advent Choral Evensong** on <u>December 11th at 5:00pm</u> in addition to a festive **Christmas Eve service** <u>at 10:00pm</u>, with a mini <u>concert beforehand at 9:30pm</u>.

We are ever grateful for the parents & guardians, board members, donors, Trinity Episcopal Church, and the larger community for helping us keep this program strong. Thank you, all, for your continued support.

### **Levels** of Giving

#### Donation Level

#### Value



White Level (Up to \$50)

One chorister's set of 5 curriculum books





Light Blue Level (\$51-\$100) One chorister's tailored vestments (cassock and cotta)



\$95.00 + shipping (CM Almy)



Dark Blue Level (\$101-\$250) A used, 61-note practice keyboard for 1 chorister's piano lessons

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\$230 + shipping (Guitar Center)



Red Level (\$250-\$500) One year of stipends for a chorister leader (Prefect or Head Chorister)



\$15/wk for 36 weeks of rehearsals & services = \$540



Yellow Level (\$501-\$1000) One year of weekly, individual piano lessons for one chorister





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Bronze Level (\$1001-\$2500) Cost of Choir Course Week facilitators and supplies

\$400-\$500 for guest facilitators, ~\$300 in snacks/drinks, and ~\$250 in supplies (choir folders, pencils, notebooks, etc.)
= \$1,050



Silver Level (\$2501-\$5000) Total Cost for overnight NYC trip in January to perform at the Chorister Festival

~\$1,500 in hotel costs, \$376 in train tickets, ~\$600 in meals, \$195 in application fee = \$2,671



Gold Level (\$5,000+) Cost for I chorister, per year to be in The Choir School of Hartford (with our current size and budget)



Music director salary, admin salary, cost of piano lessons & supplies, cost of curriculum, chorister stipends, instrument upkeep, vestments, bank fees, promotion, etc. = \$66,000 per year (\$5,500 per kid for 12 total)




#### Recent Graduates






The Choir School of Hartford is a non-profit organization, offering tuition-free music education for children and youth between the ages of 8–18 with musical potential.

We rehearse every Tuesday and Thursday from 6:00-7:30pm as well as Sundays from 9:00-9:45am for weekly 10:00am services. Our season runs from September - June, with a week-long course in late August.

Auditions take about 20-30mins and include sight-reading, scales, rhythm exercises, and a brief conversation about the applicant's musical interests/experience.
